The Counseling Department is committed to providing students with a multitude of opportunities to learn about the higher education options available to them after graduation.

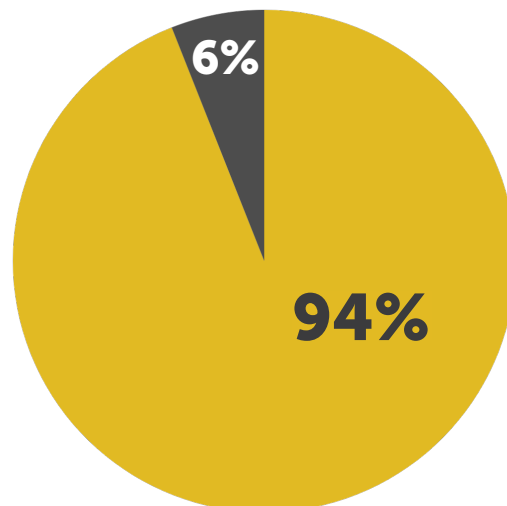

During the 2023–2024 school year, **nearly 50% of BFC students** took at least one AP exam, with **74% receiving a passing score of 3 or above** to qualify for college credit.
