ADMISSIONS ADVENTURES IN THIS UNUSUAL YEAR



2020 was wonderful opportunity for change, and in that spirit, Bishop Foley Catholic has significantly restructured the admissions process to improve the experience of applying for both prospective families and current staff. BFC has transitioned to a new admissions and enrollment management software, FACTS, to create a more cohesive experience for families.

Foley has also had to adapt to a new way of connecting with prospective families. Some popular admissions events, such as High School Nights and Open House, have had to be reformatted to adhere to public health guidelines. Two virtual High School Night sessions were hosted, featuring live talks with staff members and prerecorded messages from current students discussing what they love about Foley. While adjusting to a new virtual medium was undoubtedly a challenge, the engagement received from prospective families during both sessions have inspired more virtual opportunities like this in the future to expand outreach beyond normal demographics.

Likewise, in-person admissions events were a resounding success, as Foley was fortunate enough to be able to hold two appointment-based open houses in fall and spring — as well as a virtual version that is available to view online — a Welcome Party and two Welcome Picnics. Thanks to the dedication, cooperation and resilience of its staff, parent volunteers and visiting families, BFC rose above the challenges posed by the pandemic to share everything that makes Foley so special with future Ventures.

2014 GRADUATE VENTURES INTO THE REAL WORLD — AND THE ODDS ARE IN HER FAVOR

For many graduates, post-college employment complications and cancellations are among the many blows dealt by the COVID-19 pandemic. But for Bishop Foley alumna Ashley Rapp, that obstacle quickly became an opportunity. At the time the coronavirus had officially impacted Michigan, Rapp was finishing her Master of Public Health degree in epidemiology. Preparations were already underway for her thesis submission and commencement speech, then suddenly, the world came to a halt. COVID cases, hiring freezes and unemployment rates all skyrocketed while college students' glimmers of hope continued to plummet.

"This is the time where we need public health the most, yet it was really hard to break into the field at such a point of change and fear and a lot of questions," she said. "I have the skills, I have the necessary education to make a difference right now, and so I really felt like I needed to do something."

Having interned for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Rapp was deployed to the Detroit Health Department, where she assisted in data analysis and accessible communication to the Detroit community. From there, she transitioned into a full-time position as an epidemiologist for Henry Ford Health System, where she continues to utilize data and statistics to better understand the effects of the pandemic on various populations.

"It's our job in this space to make sure everything we do know is useful and helpful for people," she said. "We're not scaring them, we're not fear-mongering. We're just really trying to be as supportive as possible and be there for the people we're serving."

As an epidemiologist, one of Rapp's areas of focus is the social determinants of health, many of which were drastically impacted by the pandemic. Rapp cited food insecurities stemming from loss of income as one of the most prevalent, yet overlooked, of these issues.

I thought that my role in this pandemic was just watching and learning, but I realized, as so many issues are being brought to light during the pandemic, that, even though I was young [and] new in the field, that didn't mean that I didn't have something important to say and that what I was working on wasn't valid."

Inspired by St. Therese of Lisieux's motto to "do small things with great love," Rapp and her sister Olivia ('16) volunteered for Forgotten Harvest, a nonprofit organization that aims to address hunger and food insecurity in the Detroit metropolitan area.

Rapp's endeavors to help underrepresented groups has extended into the Chaldean community, for whom she has advocated equal representation in healthcare for several years. Last year, she spearheaded a campaign encouraging voter turnout among Chaldean and Assyrian American women for the 2020 election as part of this initiative. The movement eventually caught the attention of Michigan Gov. Gretchen Whitmer, who Rapp had the opportunity to interview during a Facebook Live session.

"Being able to directly talk to the governor was important to me because, as a young Chaldean woman, a lot of people in my community never had opportunities like this back in the day," Rapp said. "Sometimes we lose sight of the fact that there's so much going on besides just a presidential election, and that, a lot of the time, these local things impact us even more than anything at the federal level."

Rapp has attributed much of her success to her experiences at Foley, which she said she could not have had anywhere else. She credits the debate team with helping her find her voice, and the swim team for forcing her out of her comfort zone — "they threw me in the water and realized I couldn't float!" Student Council gave her the opportunity to learn and grow alongside her sisters, Emily ('15) and Olivia, and boyfriend (now fiancé) Stephen Redding ('14), who also served as representatives.

"It was so dorky," she quipped, "[... but] it was just so fun to have all my people in one place."

It was the teaching staff, however, that had the most profound impact on her – namely, Spanish teacher Shonna Proctor.

"She was this woman with a huge personality ... everything that I wanted to be," Rapp said of Proctor. "She was confident, she was empowered, she spoke her mind, and those were things that, at the time — I don't know, I was 14, I didn't feel comfortable doing any of that, but I wanted to ... I wanted to be as happy and as confident as her."

Rapp also cited Erin Masen's psychology class as an influence on her decision to study psychology as an undergraduate, and theology teacher Ken Pullis for teaching her about leadership and authenticity.

According to Rapp, her experiences as a Venture are encapsulated by one big takeaway — try everything.

"I think having that attitude and that drive to make yourself uncomfortable while trying to find what you love is really the best way to challenge yourself," she said. "For me, it paid off."



CONQUERING THE COVID-19 REQUIREMENTS

Bishop Foley clubs and sports adapt to the many unique restrictions set by school and state

Since nearly 90% of Bishop Foley Catholic students participate in at least one extracurricular activity, the majority of the student body have been affected by the unique circumstances put in play this school year. Despite these changes, the dedication and adaptability of coaches, mentors and teachers have allowed our programs to continue to inspire and enrich the student population in a variety of new ways, from the performing arts to athletics.

EXTRACURRICULAR CLUBS

With large gatherings restricted, many BFC teams and clubs who compete or perform have found unique solutions to continue to practice their passion safely.

The BFC Forensics team has continued to hone their public speaking skills in preparation for competition, which usually take place at local Catholic high schools. While most participants have competed from the comfort of their home by joining in to Zoom tournaments with laptops or iPads to stream their performance, BFC students opted to dress professionally and meet on campus for their scheduled performances.

"[Our] students want to compete here at school because they feel like it would mirror what a real tournament would feel like," said Carol Osborn, who coaches the team. "Thanks to our administration and with a little pre-planning, our team has been able to keep socially distant and perform. We've arranged for each student to be in a separate room so that they are not in any danger of spreading germs to their fellow teammates."

The Foley Freeze, Bishop Foley's robotics team, also had standard competitions moved remotely for both the 2020 and 2021 seasons. This year, in place of gathering thousands of students, mentors and parents together, the FIRST organization has crafted a unique competition experience to optimize social distancing and safety. Team members met safely in person on campus and virtually via Microsoft Teams, brainstorming for new challenges to supplement the time dedication usually required for multiple competitions.

Rehearsals and requirements have been impacted for the performing arts as well. For the fall play, choreography was adapted for social distancing, and masks were amended into the costuming. Drama director Mimi Lewalski paid careful attention to who handled props on stage, how characters interacted without direct contact, and best practices for those behind the scenes.

While both "Harvey" and the spring musical, "The Pirates of Penzance," were performed to a limited crowd, the annual Christmas concert transitioned exclusively to a virtual audience. Rehearsals were condensed into videos, which were uploaded online for students to share with their families. To conclude the perfomance schedule this year, the Spring Concert & Art Show was hosted for a limited audience at BFC with a livestream available online.

While these steps are not ideal, the performing arts department is proud to have been able to continue to extend these experiences to passionate students while prioritizing their safety.

ATHLETICS

The fall and winter seasons for our various athletics programs have been tumultuous, with games and championships cancelled due to health concerns. However, this did not stop athletes and coaches from being recognized, from students making the Division 7 All-Region Rosters and football coach Brian Barnes being named as Coach of the Year, to swimmers setting new records and qualifying for the State Finals.

Fall sports were grateful to complete the majority of their seasons, with awards and honors being earned across cross country, boys soccer, football, swim and volleyball. BFC Football qualified for the Division 7 District Championship to conclude their season.

Although the official playing season for winter sports began late, teams continued to meet for practice and scrimmage to develop skills, teamwork and ethics even while being unable to compete with direct contact. In February, ice hockey, basketball and wrestling were able to rejoin bowling in active competition. Sanitary measures continue to be in place to ensure safe environments.

In addition to playing their respective sports, many BFC athletes participate in the BFC chapter of Catholic Athletes for Christ, where students participate in missionary activities in the community.

In addition to his many duties as the Theology department head at Bishop Foley Catholic, hosting bible study events at Guardian Angels Catholic Church and being a spiritual leader to many, as well as a husband and father, Tim McCormick has recently become a published author. While discussing his process and vision while writing "Confessions of a Ugly-Bible Reader," McCormick elaborated on the reason he was inspired to begin writing.

"I teach freshmen Theology Scripture, so I'm always in the back of mind thinking, 'how do I encourage my kids to read scripture more?'" McCormick said. "So the book itself has those students in the background, including adults in my Bible study and Bible school-type instruction, so I want to encourage them to get into the scriptures, not in an overtly-academic sense or looking at the Bible as a manual. It's not a manual, either — it's something to live with every day and to struggle with, not always take easy answers."

With this in mind, McCormick sought to find ways to bring the act of embracing Scripture to his readers in a new light, including the importance of making the Bible your own and something you want to read from.


"'Confessions' goes back to an idea of just being honest and struggling with the text," he said. "The reality is, when you read from your 'ugly Bible,' you're encountering God of the every-day. I start the book by explaining an experience: I was at a prayer group 20 years ago, there was this lady who was probably in

her 70s and she had this big Bible. It was held together by ... duct tape and rubber bands. I looked through it and it was written in, she had underlined almost the whole thing, clearly had written and read it over 40 years. I said, 'Would you ever want a new one? This is going to fall apart,' and she said, 'No, this my most treasured possession.' This is something she had read and communicated with God in for decades. It inspired me."

"Part of my Bible has coffee stains on the edges," continued McCormick. "But every time I see it, I laugh. That's what the Bible should do. It's a true encounter, because God meets us in the ordinary. You think of burning bush moments with Moses, and those happen, but God doesn't do that most of the time. It's changing my kid's diaper, it's not cussing the guy out who cuts me off when I'm driving to work in the morning — those encounters. So those are my confessions, moving away from that and meeting God in the ordinary, and trying to encourage people to do the same."

Tim hopes that readers of "Confessions of an Ugly-Bible Reader" are able to find their Bible and allow it to transform them while personalizing it into part of their lives. "Confessions" is now available for purchase online.
